2. Honestly, has there ever been a season when YOU have practiced Christianity for the wrong reasons? Explain.
3. Why do you think the crowds were trying to make Jesus their king in vv. 14-15? Are there any ways in which we do similar things today?
4. How did Jesus respond to this attempt by the crowds to make Him their King and why do you think He did this? Any lessons for us today?
5. Despite their appearance of genuinely seeking Jesus in vv. 22-24, what did Jesus identify as their true motive in v. 26?
6. Are there any ways in which we can, likewise, seek out Jesus for our own personal desires? Please give some examples.
7. What is the first correction that Jesus gives to the crowds in v. 27? What message do you think He was trying to convey here?
8. What two questions did the crowds go on to ask Jesus in vv. 30-33 and how did He answer them in each case?
9. Honestly, are there any ways in which you've been seeking your satisfaction in the "bread" of the world rather than that of heaven? How is Jesus calling you to respond to today's passage?
